#### **IET Farady Challenge**

In November six Year 8 students went on a trip where they were up against different schools for the IET Faraday Challenge day at St Olave's Grammar school.

The students were given a brief in which they had to create a prototype to make the roads safer for everyone. What they came up with was brilliant, they thought about how some roads get flooded easily and how to prevent that from happening, they created a mechanism where water will be drained and recycled for other purposes. They created a working prototype which included a sensor.



Students showed great resilience and worked on their teamwork skills throughout the day. Although they did not win, they still managed to keep up with the other grammar schools and the score was very

Both at school and at home we will have experienced the fact that when students hear us say the word 'revise' they don't always know what to do or they do things that don't actually help them remember the information. By being able to give them a specific activity to do such as making and using flashcards or completing a low stakes quiz, we can actively support them in retaining knowledge.














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#### The Music Department
